The Service of the Word

Rite One – For today and the next two Sundays, from the Fourth Sunday of Easter (April 21) through Rogation Sunday (May 5), our service will use Rite One, an ancient liturgy retained in the Anglican communion since the 17th century. The Episcopalians who founded Grace Episcopal Church in 1835 would have used a very similar liturgy—Rite One only modestly revised Cranmer's 1662 Book of Common Prayer. John 10:11-18

Priest: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

[Jesus said,] ¹¹“I am the good shepherd. The Holy Eucharist

Holy Communion is a sacrament in which we receive holy gifts and become holy people. We call it Eucharist, which means "thanksgiving." In the Episcopal Church, all who claim the name Christian are welcome to share in Holy Communion. If you do not wish to receive, you are still welcome to come to the altar and cross your arms over your chest and receive a blessing.



And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also

that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;
