The Service of the Word

Rite One – For today our service will use Rite One, an ancient liturgy retained in the Anglican communion since the 17th century. The Episcopalians who founded Grace Episcopal Church in 1835 would have used a very similar liturgy—Rite One only modestly revised Cranmer's 1662 Book of Common Prayer.





The Holy Eucharist

Holy Communion is a sacrament in which we receive holy gifts and become holy people. We call it Eucharist, which means "thanksgiving." In the Episcopal Church, all who claim the name Christian are welcome to share in Holy Communion. If you do not wish to receive, you are still welcome to come to the altar and cross your arms over your chest and receive a blessing.



Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy people do celebrate and make, with these thy holy gifts which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also

that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;



Episcopal Haiku

We Episcopalians come from many places, we have many spiritual paths, and believe many things. Shocking, I know. In our communion there has traditionally been more a focus on the words and actions we use when we pray together ("common prayer" as our book title has it) than what is going on in our heads when we do it. "It is a most invaluable part of that blessed 'liberty wherewith Christ hath made us free,' that in his worship different forms and usages may without offense be allowed, provided the substance of the Faith be kept entire" (Book of Common Prayer, p. 9). So "we, who are many and diverse, come together in Christ through our worship, our common prayer." (https://www.episcopalchurch.org/what-we-believe/.) But we do have a relatively unique approach to church governance (e.g. decision-making), and arguably, to inclusion and reading scripture.

This summer, our Bishop is visiting, and the office of the Bishop is also symbol of the unity of the church. She is empowered to recognize and welcome Christians who have been practicing their faith in other churches, and fully include them as new Episcopalians.
