Mark 6:1-13

Priest: The Holy Gospel of our Savior Jesus Christ according to Mark.



Convention Updates – General Convention 2024 handled 390 resolutions, here are a few highlights: The Rt. Rev. Sean Rowe was elected the 28th presiding bishop of The Episcopal Church. For more details on the Chicago deputation: <https://episcopalchicago.org/bishop-sean-w-rowe-elected-28th-presiding-bishop/>. Rowe, who is the youngest bishop ever elected as Presiding Bishop, will begin his 9 year term on November 1.

While in Louisville, the convention also "reelected Julia Ayala Harris as House of Deputies president, elected the Rev. Steve Pankey as deputies' vice president, passed a \$143 million budget for the next triennium, approved a constitutional change to clearly define the Book of Common Prayer, reexamined its clergy disciplinary canons while agreeing to consider how lay leaders might be disciplined for wrongdoing, and supported changes in the structures of seven of its dioceses... Convention continued the church's public witness against gun violence and hosted a panel discussion on the church's role in Indigenous boarding schools. Presiding Bishop Michael Curry's last signature revival

service at the KFC Yum! Center drew a crowd of more than 2,000 people who heard him urge everyone to 'choose love because love can save us.'”
