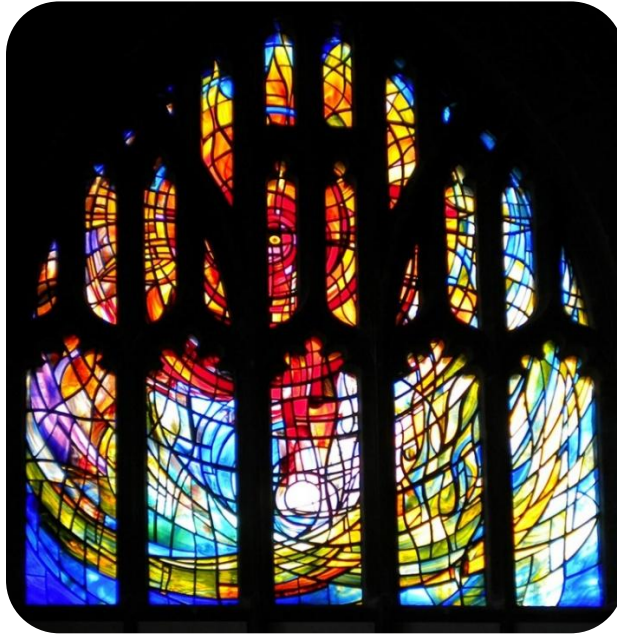


Image: Healing Window in Manchester Cathedral, installed to commemorate the restoration of the cathedral following the IRA bombing in 1996.

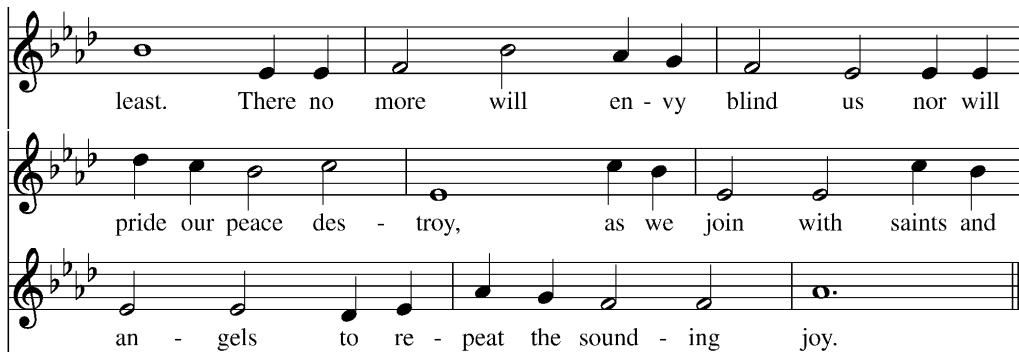

Mass in the Grass – This year Mass in the Grass will be held on September 7 at 10:30 am, at the Northern Lights Pavilion at Rec Park, 1721 Field Street, Galena. Coming from Galena, this is the first turn off on your right near the first parking lot. Coming from GTA, it is the second turn off on your left, after the pool turn. (There are not many flowers at Rec Park, but if you happen to be allergic to bees, consider your epipen.) There are some picnic tables and benches, but if you prefer a lawn chair, please bring one. Pets are welcome, appropriately restrained. (But we will bless animals on October 5, the Feast of St Francis.) Please sign up for the potluck in the parish hall.

Learn Morning Prayer - Are you curious about how to use your prayerbook to pray? Do you want to learn or refresh your knowledge of how to pray the daily office? The Daily Office is what we Episcopalians call our services of morning prayer, noonday prayer, evening prayer and compline (the night office, which Lynn Giles leads every Tuesday evening on Zoom.) Here at Grace we have a strong tradition of using the daily office. In the 1820s, lay Episcopalians read the daily office together for years before the Galena group could persuade a clergy person to move here. Now on Wednesdays once a month, a lay person leads Morning Prayer. Do you also want to learn? On Wednesday September 17, at 8:00 am, Mother Paula will lead an instructed service of Morning Prayer.... including how to use a prayerbook or the easy way, with an app. Please join

us. (If you have not recently come to Wednesday service, our group usually goes out to breakfast at a local restaurant afterwards; that's great too.)
